Day 1: Auckland

On arrival in Auckland Airport, go to the Budget Rental Car counter located within the arrivals hall to collect your Budget rental car and make your way to your accommodation

Auckland is an exciting, sporting and cultural city, sprawled on a narrow isthmus, between two harbours. The Waitemata and Manukau Harbours, are a main feature of the city, along with numerous volcanic cones such as Mount Eden and Rangitoto Island. The city's many beaches, marinas and parks, make it ideal for outdoor pursuits such as yachting, rugby, cricket or a day at the beach. The Auckland metropolitan area is New Zealand's biggest city, and the population mix of European, Maori, and Pacific Islander, make Auckland the largest Polynesian city in the World.




Day 2: Auckland

Today is a free day but admission to the Skytower (Sky Deck and main observation deck) is included as well as admission to the Auckland War Memorial – these tickets can be used whenever you choose. We would suggest that you do the Skytower first to give yourself an overview of the city before heading out to the Museum.

At the Auckland War Memorial Museum where exciting stories of the Pacific, New Zealand's people, the flora and fauna and landforms of these unique islands, are told within a memorial dedicated to those who have sacrificed their lives for their country.

In one of New Zealand's most outstanding historical buildings, boldly situated in the Domain - a central city pleasure garden - you encounter exhibitions



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showcasing the artistic legacy and cultures of the peoples of the Pacific; the monumental carvings, buildings, canoes and taonga (treasures) of the Maori; and the diversity of cultures which now combine to form the rich tapestry of race, nationality and creed which is modern New Zealand.

Day 3: Auckland – Waitomo - Rotorua

This morning you depart Auckland and travel south - perhaps visit Manukau with its large Polynesian community and the Otara Street Market. Travel over the Bombay Hills until you reach Hamilton which has a sprawling public park featuring Italian Renaissance to Japanese and traditional Maori gardening styles. At Otorohanga follow the road signs to the Waitomo Caves and check-in at the Cave World office.

Enjoy a 3.5km courtesy shuttle to the cave while your guide reveals the rich history of Waitomo. Then take a short walk through breathtaking native bush to the cave entrance. Your guide lights candles setting the scene for an intimate cave experience where you will see the glow-worms and cave formations up close and get to appreciate the beauty of Footwhistle Cave. At the conclusion of the tour, follow the road signs leading to Rotorua.

Rotorua is located on a volcanic plateau and formerly a spa town, it is most famous for its geothermal activity. As well, Rotorua is the main place in New Zealand where aspects of Maori traditions can be seen, from wood carvings, and meeting houses, to a Hangi Dinner and Maori dances.

After checking into your hotel, the rest of the day is at leisure until this evening's visit to Te Puia where you will enjoy a guided tour and Te Po Hangi and Concert this evening.

You will visit award winning interactive galleries, see a kiwi bird up close, and most importantly, hear stories as told by the descendants of the valley. To conclude the tour, you will visit the geyser and mud pools. There is a little free time before the entertainment and meal commences. Traditionally, Te Po is an intimate time for sharing knowledge, but it is also Te Puia's authentic evening cultural experience – a feast of food, culture and friendship. It begins every night at Te-Heketanga-a-Rangi. This banquet combines contemporary cuisine with a traditional hangi (earth-cooked oven meal), where kai (food) is steam-cooked by hot rocks in the earth, giving it a delicious smoky flavour. Following dessert, enjoy the spectacular lighting of the Whakarewarewa Geothermal Valley.

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Day 4: Rotorua - Christchurch

This morning before returning your car to the airport depot and catching your domestic flight to Christchurch explore the Waimangu Thermal Valley which is home to the Waimangu Geothermal System which is the newest in the World. Here you can see the Frying Pan Lake, Inferno Crater, and some rare and unusual plants and regenerating rainforest. Your admission today is for a Waimangu Valley Walk.

Upon arrival to Christchurch, pick-up your new car and make your way to your accommodation.

Day 5: Christchurch – Wanaka

It is about a 400km drive from Christchurch through to Wanaka so you may wish to get an early start. It is a beautiful drive through the endless expanse of the Canterbury Plains and along the foothills of the Alps to the turquoise glowing Lake Tekapo. There are a couple of experiences based in Tekapo (not included) but well worth doing - a flight over the Mount Cook National Park or you can drive to the summit of Mt. John where there are fantastic panoramic view of the Alps, glaciers and lakes.

Continue via Omarama with its picture-book landscape, sheep and mountain peaks dominate the scenery. The last stage is crossing Lindis Pass where a photo stop is a must.

Wanaka faces north across Lake Wanaka, to views of the surrounding mountains, which are often reflected on the Lake's surface on calm days. Poplars and willows grow around the Lake's edge, affording a colourful show during Autumn. Wanaka is best known for boating, fishing and skiing at the Cardrona and Treble Cone ski-fields.

Day 6: Wanaka – Queenstown

It is a short drive today as you head for Queenstown passing through the towns of Lowburn, Cromwell and Gibbston to Queenstown.

Queenstown is the South Island's most popular resort, set alongside the shores of Lake Wakatipu, under the gaze of the Remarkables Ranges. See the contrast of smooth glacier rounded hills, and jagged mountain summits that reach high above the ancient ice floor. The town is renowned for its jet boating, bungee-jumping, skiing and awe-inspiring scenery. Local story has it, that the gold prospectors of the 19th century pronounced the town as "fit for any Queen", and so she was called Queenstown.

We can recommend an optional tour on the TSS Earnslaw paddlewheeler up to Walter Peak Farm High Country Farm. It is a chance to view the countryside from a different perspective and includes a BBQ lunch at the Colonel's Homestead – departure time is 12 noon from Steamer Wharf.

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Day 7: Queenstown – Milford Sound – Queenstown

Milford Sound with its stunning surroundings is at the heart of Te Wahipounamu World Heritage Area. Luxuriant rainforest clings to sheer rock walls washed with waterfalls. In the foreground stands Mitre Peak, dominating the skyline. Whatever the fiord's mood, teeming with rain or with sun glistening on deep water, it will inspire you.

This morning you will travel from Queenstown along the shores of Lake Wakatipu and through rolling countryside to Te Anau. After a short break at Te Anau, continue via the spectacular Milford Road to Milford Sound. Board the Milford Mariner for a relaxing cruise of Milford Sound. The cruise provides excellent viewing opportunities and plenty of time is available to enjoy waterfalls, rainforest, mountains and wildlife.

A picnic lunch is included on board the cruise.

Day 8: Queenstown

After the long day yesterday, today is a free day in Queenstown. Before wandering around the town area, we suggest that you go to the Skyline Gondola Base and ride the gondola to Bob's Peak for a stunning view over the lake and Queenstown. Lunch is available at the top if you wish (at your own expense) but the gondola ride is included.

Day 9: Queenstown departure

Today you say farewell to this lovely city as you return your rental car to Queenstown Airport and check in for your Departure flight.
