

Ancient Egypt & Its Wonders - 11 days / 10 nights



Day 2: Cairo

Breakfast at the hotel. Full day tour to visit the Pyramids, Sphinx, Memphis & Sakkara.

The Pyramids & Sphinx were considered by the Greeks to be one of the seven wonders of the world. A single pyramid is built with over 2 million blocks, each weighing an average of two and a half tons. The Cheops Pyramid has an interior burial chamber that is open to the public. Close by is the Sphinx of Giza that dates back to 2620BC. Carved from natural limestone, it is 65 feet high and 187 feet long, with the head of a Pharaoh and the body of a lion.

Great Pyramid's entrance & Camel ride are included

Memphis was the capital of Upper & Lower Egypt during the first dynasty, about 5,000 years ago. Sakkara was the site where the first ever pyramid was built, the famous step pyramid of King Zoser.

Dinner at a local restaurant.

Overnight: Marriott Mena House, pyramid view room

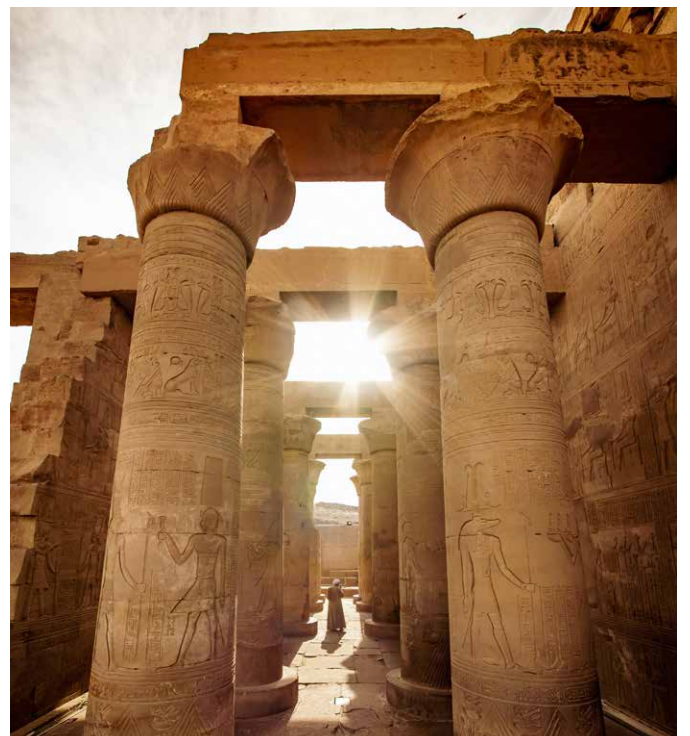
Day 3: Cairo - Luxor, by air

Breakfast at the hotel. Transfer to Cairo airport for your flight to Luxor. Once known as ancient Thebes and the capital of Upper Egypt, Luxor is renowned as the "greatest open-air museum" in the world. The Nile River divides Luxor in two, the East Bank and West Bank, considered by the ancients as Life and Death. Luxor's East Bank houses some of Egypt's most superior hotels, spas, and many restaurants. The West Bank is known for its necropolis and temples. Arrive in Luxor and check in to your hotel.

Half-day visit to the East Bank: The Temple of Luxor was the center of the most important festival, the festival of Opet. Built largely by Amenhotep III and Ramses II, the temple served as a setting for the rituals of the festival. The Karnak Temple complex covers over 2sq km, larger than some ancient cities. It comprises three main temples, smaller enclosed temples, and several outer temples. The main Temple of Amun Ra dominates the complex.

In the evening, enjoy a famous Sound and Light Show at Karnak Temple.

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Day 4: Luxor

Breakfast at the hotel. Half-day visit to the West Bank:

The first site to visit is the Valley of the Kings, famous for its royal tombs. These beautifully painted tombs have been designated a World Heritage Site by UNESCO. For over a thousand years, the kings, queens and nobles of the New Kingdom (1500-1070 B.C.) were buried in this valley.

Queen Hatshepsut Temple: One of the most spectacular monuments in Egypt, of the Queen who should be King, who reigned for 22 years.

Proceed to the Valley of the Queens to visit the burial sites of some of the royal consorts and offspring. The tour ends with a panoramic stop at the Colossi of Memnon.

(Entrance included to the tomb of King Tut & King Ramses VI)

Overnight: Sofitel Winter Palace Luxor

Day 5: Luxor – Dendera & Abydos

Breakfast at the hotel. Full day tour to Dendera & Abydos:

Drive for about 1.5 hours to Dendera to visit the Hathor Temple. Drive further to Abydos and visit the beautiful Temple of Seti I. Return to Luxor and overnight.

Overnight: Sofitel Winter Palace Luxor

Day 6: Luxor

Breakfast at the hotel

Half day tour to visit Deir el Medina, the Valley of the Nobles & Habu Temple:

The Tombs of the Nobles is home to 146 numbered tombs of noblemen and high officials who served the pharaohs, mostly during the 18th Dynasty.

Deir el-Media located on the west bank, was home to the artists who worked on the tombs in the Valley of the Kings.

Madinet Habu is nearly four miles from the Valley of the Kings and contains several spectacular monuments, most famously the Mortuary Temple of Ramses III (1184-1153 BC) one of the best-preserved temples of the New Kingdom. It was built to commemorate Ramses III, after his death, by orders of the King himself. A huge mud brick enclosure wall surrounds the temple.

Overnight: Sofitel Winter Palace Luxor

Day 7: Luxor - Edfu - Kom Ombo - Aswan

Breakfast at the hotel. Check out & transfer by car to Aswan. Stop along the way and visit the temples of Edfu & Kom Ombo.

Edfu Temple: the temple is dedicated to Horus, the avenging son of Isis and Osiris, during the Ptolemaic period.

The Temple of Kom Ombo was built during 205 to 180 BC, during the Ptolemaic period, and dedicated to Sobek and Haroeris. A 5-minute walk will bring you to the crocodile museum to see mummified crocodiles and reptiles.

Arrive in Aswan and check in to your hotel.

In the afternoon, your private guide will pick you up for a sail on a private Felucca (sailboat). Relax in comfort as you cruise the Nile around Kitchener Island, Egypt's largest botanical garden, started by the famous British army leader, Lord Kitchener. Back to hotel & overnight.

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Day 8: Aswan

Breakfast at the hotel. *Visit Philae temple & The Unfinished Obelisk & the Nubian Village*

A short trip by motorboat will bring you to Philae Island. The temple of Philae was dedicated to the goddess Isis. It is here that she found the heart of Osiris after his murder by his brother Seth.

The Unfinished Obelisk still lies where a crack was discovered as it was being carved from the rock. This obelisk would have been the largest ever erected if it hadn't cracked. The ancient tools left behind have provided archaeologists with great insight on how the work was performed.

Half day Nubian Village & Soheil Island

Depart by motorboat to the Nubian Village on Soheil Island. This fantastic 3-hour tour to the Nubian Village lets you meet and interact with a Nubian family and learn about their simple lifestyle, culture and traditions. Nubians are an ethnic group who live in the south of Egypt (Aswan) and the north of Sudan. The Nubian villages are located at the East or the West banks of the river Nile or as islands. Old villages used to be where Lake Nasser is now, and they were relocated in 1964 as a result of building the High Dam of Aswan.

Stop to walk through the village and see its traditional colorful houses built from mud brick, then visit a family and enjoy Nubian tea while discussing culture and daily life. Return to your hotel for the evening.

Overnight: Sofitel Legend Old Cataract Hotel



Day 9: Aswan - Abu Simbel - Cairo

Early breakfast at the hotel. Transfer to the airport for your flight to Abu Simbel.

Its temples, which are among the most magnificent monuments in the world, were built by the great pharaoh Ramses II almost 3 thousand years ago. What's extraordinary about this temple complex is that in the 1960's it was taken apart and rebuilt on a higher surface to make way to the Aswan Dam. After your tour, transfer to the airport for your flight to Cairo (via Aswan). Arrival in Cairo, meet your guide and transfer to your hotel in downtown Cairo, on the Nile. Afternoon at leisure to discover Cairo and its wonders.

Overnight: Fairmont Nile City, Nile view room

Day 10: Cairo

Breakfast at the hotel. A full day tour will be dedicated to the Egyptian Museum & the Khan el Khalili Bazaar.

The Egyptian Museum was built in 1897 and opened its doors in 1902. Today, the museum contains the most important collection of Egyptian antiquities in the world. Exhibited are over 120,000 objects from the Pharaonic and Graeco-Roman periods.

Lunch at a local restaurant

No visit to Cairo is complete without a stop at the Khan El-Khalili bazaar. Shop owners calling you to their stalls, the scent of spices, the hustle and bustle of trade, and the many beautiful objects that can be purchased will have you lost among the alleys for hours.

Overnight: Fairmont Nile City, Nile view room

Day 11: Cairo departure

Breakfast at the hotel. Say farewell to Egypt as you are transferred to Cairo International Airport for your departure flight.
