HIGHLIGHTS OF PERU

From the vibrant coastal capital of Lima, where world-renowned cuisine meets colonial elegance, to the white volcanic beauty of Arequipa, Peru unfolds in breathtaking contrasts. Journey into the dramatic depths of Colca Canyon, where majestic condors soar above ancient terraces, then continue to the shimmering shores of Puno on the mystical waters of Lake Titicaca. In the heart of the Andes, the imperial city of Cusco reveals a captivating blend of Inca heritage and Spanish grandeur, gateway to the timeless wonder of Machu Picchu. Nearby, the fertile landscapes of the Sacred Valley enchant with vibrant markets, living traditions, and awe-inspiring ruins, an unforgettable journey through history, culture, and natural splendor.



DAY 1: ARRIVAL IN LIMA

Upon arrival in Lima, meet and greet and transfer to your hotel.

DAY 2: LIMA

Explore the colonial town of Lima, a UNESCO World Heritage Site filled with fascinating historic buildings. Begin with a scenic tour of the colonial downtown, centered around the Main Square, where you can admire the exquisite architecture. Visit the Cathedral, whose construction began in the 16th century and took 80 years to complete. Next, continue to Casa Aliaga, a remarkable residence built on the foundations of a pre-Hispanic structure using mud and adobe. Its unique multi-level design required spaces to adapt ingeniously. The main façade features a balcony added during the Republican era, while its patios are particularly striking: the first is covered with 19th-century Italian marble, and the second is adorned with an antique bronze fountain. Impressively, the house has remained in the same family since its construction in 1535. Afterwards, transfer to the Larco Museum, home to the world's most extensive private collection of pre-Columbian art, offering a deep insight into the rich cultural heritage of ancient Peru.

DAY 3: LIMA – AREQUIPA

This morning, transfer to the airport to board your flight to Arequipa. Upon arrival, you will be transferred to your hotel. The day begins with a visit to the Yanahuara viewpoints and Carmen Alto, offering panoramic views of the city and its surroundings. Continue to the historic center, starting with the Cathedral, where you will learn about its historical and architectural significance. Visit the Company complex, where the chapel known as the Dome stands out for its unique design. Next, explore the city streets, passing iconic sites such as the San Francisco and Santo Domingo churches, before concluding the tour at the Monastery of Santa Catalina, a masterpiece of colonial architecture and artistic heritage.

DAY 4: AREQUIPA - COLCA

This morning, depart from Arequipa and travel to Chivay along the scenic route through Juliaca, Puno, and Cusco. Stop first at 3,900 meters in the Salinas and Aguada Blanca National Reserve, also known as Pampa Cañahuas. Continue into the Colca Valley with a lunch stop at Chinitos (4,000 m). Visit the Pampas of Toccra to see llamas, alpacas, local muleteers, and Andean birds, then reach the Pata Pampa viewpoint, the trip's highest point at 4,900 m, offering views of eight volcanoes forming the Andean "fire circle." Descend to Chivay (3,650 m) and transfer to your hotel. The afternoon is free to relax and enjoy the hot springs.

DAY 5: COLCA

Depart with your guide for an unforgettable journey to the breathtaking Colca Canyon. Travel through the scenic terraces of the Colca Valley to reach the famous Cruz del Cóndor viewpoint, where you can admire the canyon's vast expanse and watch majestic condors soaring in flight. On the return to Chivay, make panoramic stops at the Huayra Punko and Antahuilque viewpoints, and visit the charming village of Maca. The afternoon is at leisure to enjoy the hotel's facilities, including the Alpaca Ranch exhibition, which highlights Peru's prized alpacas and traditional textile techniques; the Condor Interpretation Center, dedicated to the region's iconic birdlife; and the photographic exhibition "Visions of Colca," celebrating the culture and ancestral heritage of the Colca Valley.

HIGHLIGHTS OF PERU - 14 DAYS / 13 NIGHTS

DAY 6: COLCA - PUNO

The morning is free to enjoy the hotel's facilities. In the afternoon, transfer to Puno. Along the way, admire the mountains of the Peruvian Andes and the small farms dotted with sheep and llamas. You will also pass along the high-altitude lake of Lagunilla, home to diverse wild birds and flora, and travel through the towns of Santa Lucia and Juliaca. Upon arrival in Puno, transfer to your hotel, and the rest of the day is free to rest and acclimatize. *Transfer only with a Spanish-speaking driver.

DAY 7: PUNO

Today, visit the floating islands of Uros Islands on Lake Titicaca. The original inhabitants, said to descend from some of the Americas' oldest peoples, still practice their ancient traditions. Their dwellings, made of totora reed, float on the lake's surface. Next, continue to the unique Island of Taquile, where life seems untouched by time. The island's stone steps and central square create a striking Mediterranean-like atmosphere. The indigenous community of about 350 families, descendants of the Incas, is renowned for its textile crafts, including chumpis (belts), chullos (caps), and ojotas (sandals). Taquile also offers magnificent lake views framed by the snow-capped peaks of the Cordillera Real. In the afternoon, return to your hotel.

DAY 8: PUNO - CUSCO

This morning, transfer to the local bus station to board the regular tourist-class bus to Cusco. The full-day journey begins at 06:50, with cultural and historical stops along the way. First, visit the Pucará Archaeological Complex, an important pre-Inca ceremonial center of the Andean highlands. Continue to La Raya Pass, the highest point of the route and the natural divide between the Lake Titicaca basin and the Cusco region. After a buffet lunch in Sicuani, visit Raqchi, home to the impressive Temple of Wiracocha, and then San Pedro Apóstol de Andahuaylillas, often called the "Sistine Chapel of America" for its remarkable interior artwork. Upon arrival in Cusco, transfer to your hotel.

DAY 9: CUSCO

Morning at leisure, followed by a city tour of Cusco. Discover the city's rich heritage through its unique blend of Inca and Spanish colonial landmarks. Visit the historic Main Square, once known as Huacaypata, and the Cathedral, built over the former Inca temple of Suntur Wasi. Continue to the Church and Convent of Santo Domingo, constructed atop the sacred Qorikancha, the Temple of the Sun. Explore the impressive archaeological sites surrounding the city, including Sacsayhuamán, a monumental ceremonial fortress overlooking Cusco, as well as Tambomachay, Qenqo, and Puka Pukara, each showcasing the Incas' architectural mastery, spiritual beliefs, and military organization.

HIGHLIGHTS OF PERU - 14 DAYS / 13 NIGHTS

DAY 10: CUSCO – SACRED VALLEY

Departure to the Sacred Valley and the archaeological complex of Pisac. On the way, stop along the route to take some pictures and admire the Pucara Bulls on the roofs of Andean houses. These small bulls are thought to be amulets that bring wealth to each family that owns them and are usually given as gifts at weddings. On arrival at the archaeological complex of Pisac, begin your tour of the site during a hike around the area and appreciate the magnificent Andean terraces, which were built to expand the agricultural lands. After lunch, head to the town of Ollantaytambo, with its distinct Inca urban planning. Visit the religious, astronomical, and military complex, and observe how the ancient Peruvians moved boulders of nearly 60 metric tons from one mountain to another, across rivers and valleys.

DAY 11: SACRED VALLEY

Today you will visit Chinchero, a small traditional village on the way from Cusco to Urubamba. In Chinchero, visit a traditional weaving workshop and enjoy a presentation on how local artisans use natural products such as plants, minerals, and insects to create the colors used in their textiles. On Sundays, there may also be time to visit the Chinchero Market. Continue to the Moray, a unique complex of circular terraces believed to have been an Inca agricultural experimentation center used to adapt crops to different microclimates. Enjoy lunch at UNU Restaurant, surrounded by the Andean mountains. Afterwards, continue to the Maras Salt Mines, where an ancient drying process is still used. Salt water from an underground stream fills thousands of shallow pools and, once evaporated, leaves behind crystallized salt ready to be harvested.

DAY 12: SACRED VALLEY – MACHU PICCHU - CUSCO

This morning, transfer to the train station to board the train to Machu Picchu, a remarkable UNESCO World Heritage Site. Hidden for centuries, this archaeological wonder was brought to international attention in the early 1900s by the famous explorer Hiram Bingham. It is impossible to describe the awe you will feel when confronted with the Citadel—a massive complex nestled between mountains and jungle, a breathtaking challenge to the imagination. Upon arrival at Aguas Calientes, you will be greeted at the train station and transferred uphill to Machu Picchu (approximately 20 minutes). Once at the Citadel, begin your guided tour and immerse yourself in the history of this mysterious and impressive site. In the afternoon, return to Aguas Calientes to explore the village at your leisure. Later, at a coordinated time, board the train back to Poroy, followed by a transfer to your hotel in Cusco.

Today is a free day for personal activities or to explore the city on your own.
